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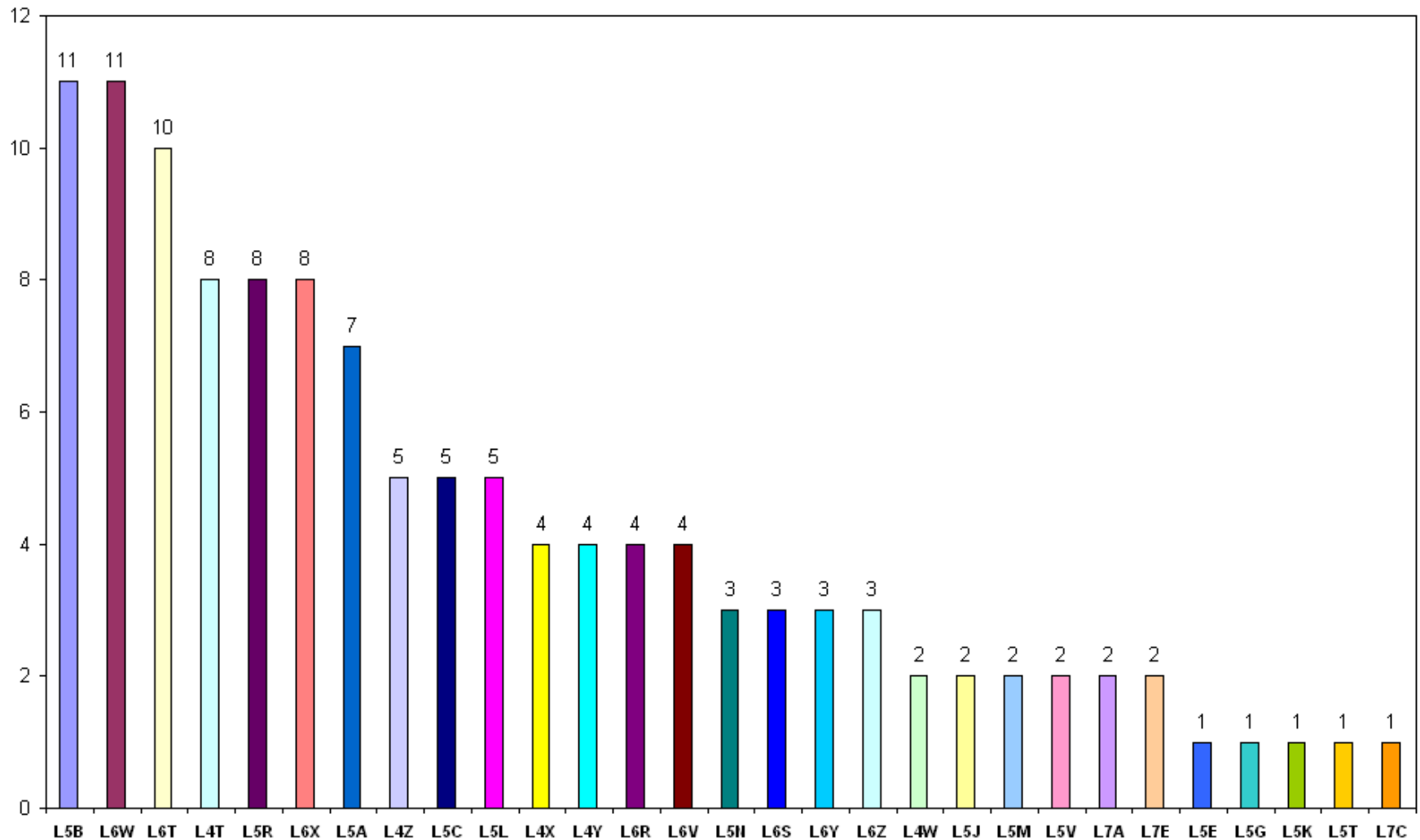
Planning Objectives

- ❖ To examine the different social, economic and health services available for the Peel residents.
- ❖ To assess the level of settlement services in different neighbourhoods of Peel by using *taxonomic method*.
- ❖ To explore the relationship between the concentration of recent immigrants and level of settlement services status in Peel neighbourhoods.
- ❖ To set potential targets for the level of settlement services indicators for a less developed neighbourhood (for example: L4T; Malton) in Peel by using the *taxonomic method*.
- ❖ To assess the level of QOL in different neighbourhoods of Peel by using *taxonomic method*.

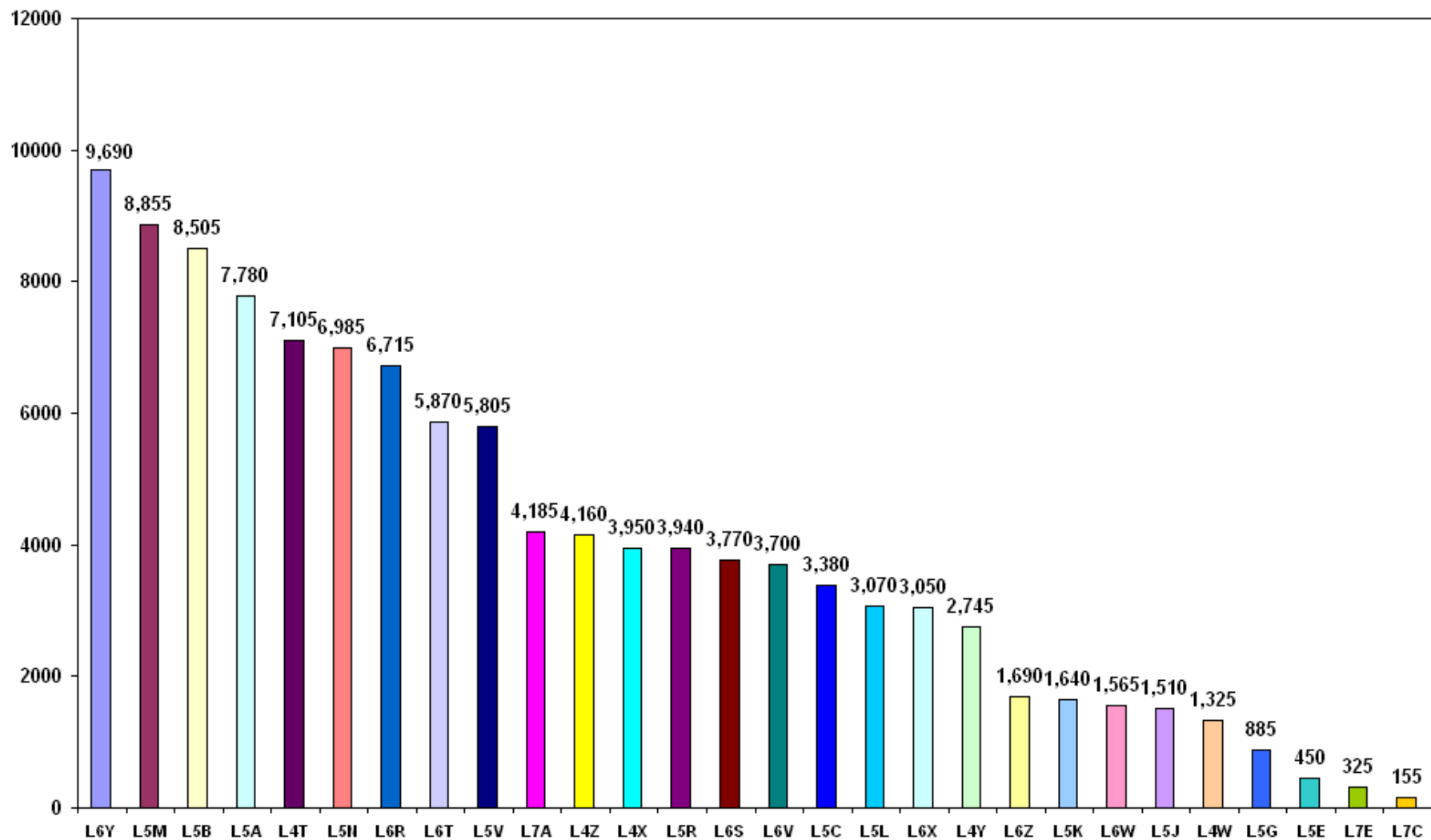

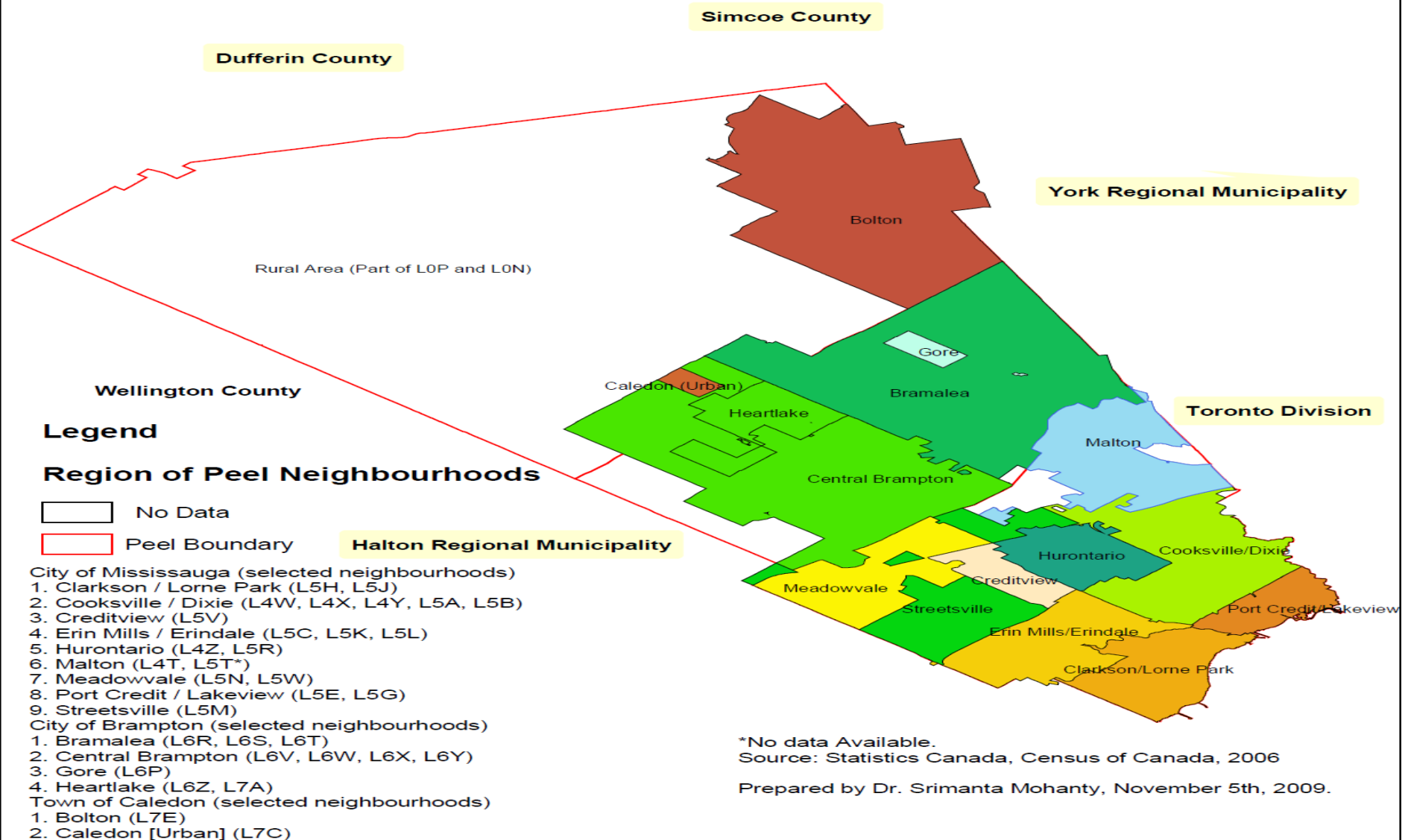

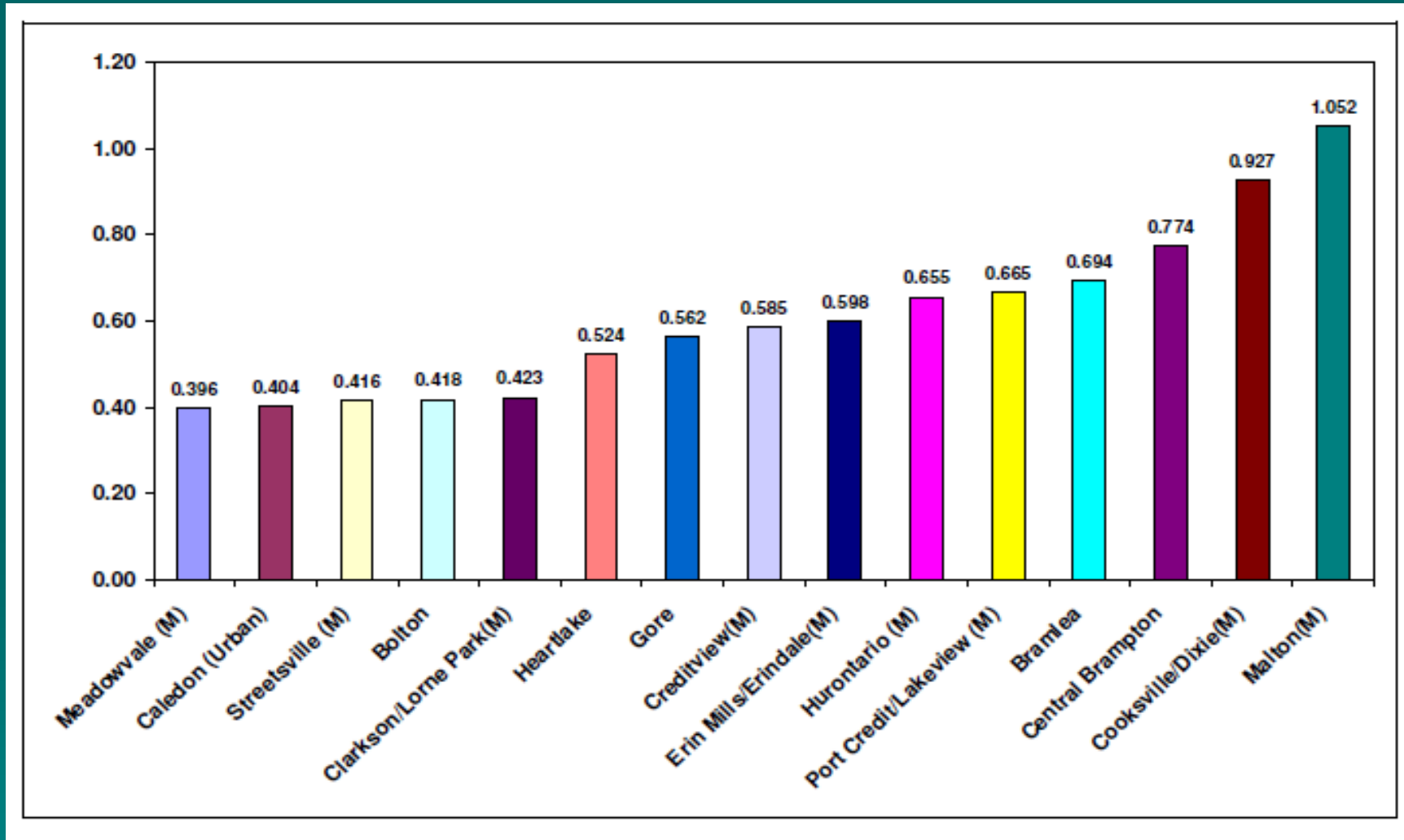
