



A SOCIO-ECONOMIC PROFILE OF THE BLACK POPULATION IN PEEL, 2006 AND 2011

F.A.C.E.S. of Peel Collaborative | September 2014

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

As of 2011, there were 116,265 Black people living in Peel Region (a growth of 21.8% since 2006). This report provides an overview of selected demographic and socio-economic characteristics of the Black population in Peel. The information provided may be useful for determining priorities for social services and community development for the Black community in Peel Region as a whole and within specific Peel municipalities.

The report is divided into two sections. The first section provides demographic information as per the 2011 National Household Survey (NHS). The second section provides more specific socio-economic information by forward sortation area (FSA)*. Due to limited availability of data from the NHS, this information is based on data from Statistics Canada's 2006 Census of Canada for residents in private households only (Special Custom Cross-Tabulation).

Blacks in Peel Compared to Blacks in Ontario and Canada, 2006 & 2011

Peel has a greater proportion of Black people within its population than Ontario or Canada. Blacks comprise 9.0% of the total Peel population; 4.3% of the Ontario population, and 2.9% of the Canadian population. Furthermore, between 2006 and 2011, the rate of growth of the black population in Peel was 21.8% versus only 14.3% in Ontario and 21.1% in Canada. The vulnerabilities and strengths of Blacks living in Peel are revealed through further comparison between the Black population in Peel and the Black population in Ontario and Canada.

Peel Versus Ontario and Canada, 2011:

- Compared to Ontario and Canada, Peel has a higher proportion of ethnic origins reported as African and Selected Caribbean¹ and a higher proportion of Jamaican immigrants.
- Peel has a lower male to female ratio within its Black population and a smaller proportion of immigrants from Haiti than Ontario or Canada.
- Peel has a larger proportion of immigrants from Africa in comparison to Ontario, but a smaller proportion compared to Canada.

Peel Versus Ontario and Canada, 2006:

With richer data available from the 2006 Census of Canada [Special Custom Cross-Tabulation], a more detailed contrast can be seen. A comparative perspective of Peel yields a picture which says that on average, the Black population in Peel, compared to the Black population of Ontario and Canada as a whole, is:

- more likely to report English as their mother tongue
- more family-oriented
- more property conscious (likely to own their homes)
- better-educated (more likely to have high school education or above)
- more involved in the labour market
- richer (economically speaking), and
- more diverse (likely to be born outside Canada)

¹ "Selected Caribbean" origins includes, from the origins reported by Statistics Canada, those that are associated with a Caribbean country that has a population with over 85% Black people. This was determined using figures from The World Factbook (see Appendix A).

- As can be seen above, Brampton had the highest proportion of Blacks within its population, a faster rate of growth of its Black population than Mississauga, and the highest proportion of ethnic origins reported as African/Selected
- Caribbean.
- Brampton also had the closest male to female ratio, though all of the municipalities had more Black females than Black males.

^{*} Recent immigrants are immigrants who landed in Canada between January 1, 2006 and May 10, 2011.

- Mississauga had the greatest proportion of African immigrants, while Brampton had the greatest proportion of Jamaican immigrants. (There was no significant immigration from other Caribbean countries with high Black populations).
- The highest African immigration in Mississauga was from Egypt, while in Brampton it was from Nigeria, and in Caledon it was from South Africa. (It is important to emphasize that not all people reporting origins or being born in Africa will identify as being Black.)
- While Caledon's Black population grew at the fastest rate, it still had the lowest proportion of Blacks within its population, compared to Brampton and Mississauga.
- Despite the high rate of growth of the Black population in Caledon between 2006 and 2011, there was no recent immigration of Blacks to Caledon from Africa or Jamaica (as of 2011). This suggests the increase may be due to Blacks moving to Caledon from other places in Canada or countries outside of Africa and the Caribbean.

Conclusion

The Black population in Peel has continued to grow. While it has experienced some vulnerabilities, such as a relatively high percentage of people living on low incomes, it has also shown resilience with a large proportion of homeowners and a fair number of people earning over \$50,000 per year. Furthermore, compared to the Black populations of Ontario and Canada as a whole, Blacks in Peel experience better socio-economic conditions in their personal lives.

The information conveyed in this report is intended to provide a general picture of the Black population in Peel, which may be used to aid in appropriately planning and prioritizing services. To examine more specific geographic areas of interest, the reader may wish to refer to Section II of the report, which contains socioeconomic characteristics of the Black population by FSA (by postal code). While the data provided should be used with caution due to its age, it serves as a starting point for aiding in community planning and may provide a basis for further research.

Introduction

A. Background

Peel Region consists of the cities of Mississauga and Brampton, and the Town of Caledon. Next to the South Asians, the Black population is the second largest visible minority group in Peel.

Blacks are defined as persons whose ethnic or ancestral origins are in Africa, especially Sub-Saharan Africa. According to the 2011 Census, 12.3% of the Black population in Canada resided in Peel. The number of Blacks living in Peel grew from 95,490 to 116,265 between 2006 and 2011, a rate of 21.8%. This was greater than the respective growth rate for Blacks in Ontario and Canada as a whole.

B. Purpose of the Report

The purpose of this report is to provide information on the socio-economic conditions of Black people living in Peel, which can be used in the prioritization and planning of services for this group. The report is part of a larger project being conducted on behalf of Faces of Peel, which intends to examine the different social, economic, environmental and health aspects of the Black population in Peel.

C. Focus & Organization of the Report

The focus of this report is twofold. The first section centers on providing updated information on the Peel's Black Population as per the 2011 National Household Survey (NHS). This includes information on the size, growth and gender of Blacks living in Peel as well as more general information on African/Caribbean origins and immigration in Peel. This information is provided for Canada, Ontario, Peel, and its municipalities: Mississauga, Brampton and Caledon. The second section contains socio-economic Fact Sheets on the Black population in Peel by Forward Sortation Area (FSA)*. These Fact Sheets provide more specialized data such as information on age, place of birth, immigration, language, marital status, home ownership, family status, household living arrangements, education, employment and income. This section is based on 2006 Census information (for residents of private households only) due to limited availability of data from the NHS.

D. Target Audience

This report is intended for:

- the human services sector of Peel;
- funders of non-profit social service agencies and community groups;
- public policy makers in Peel; and
- the Black community in Peel.

E. Data Sources Used for the Report

- Statistics Canada, Census of Canada, Special Custom Cross-Tabulation, 2006 (includes residents in private households only).
- Statistics Canada, National Household Survey, Community Profile, 2011.
- The Social Planning Council of Peel, A Social Profile of the Black Population in Peel Region, 2006, January 2009.

F. Limitations

This report includes information from both the 2006 mandatory long-form census and the 2011 National Household Survey. Because of changes in the data collection process, the 2011 statistics may be subject to quality issues and the two sets of data may not be completely comparable. In addition, due to limited availability of data, there is no information on health or crime, and few recent statistics specific to the Black population. Finally, while much of the 2006 data is very rich and while the information by FSA may provide very useful for planning, the reader must keep in mind that this data is 8 years old and therefore must be used with caution as demographics may have shifted within this time period. Comparison of indicators at the FSA and City level are beyond the scope of this report. This level of analysis will be addressed through future reports. For further details on these limitations, please see Appendix D.

Please note that all Black population statistics are for residents in private households. Totals may not exactly equal the sum of their components due to rounding.

١. Demographic Overview of The Black Population in Peel

The Black Population in Peel by Size and Growth, 2011

Highlights

- As of 2011, there were 116,265 Black people living in Peel.
- There was a greater proportion of Black people in the total Peel population compared to the Black population in Ontario or Canada as a whole (9.0% versus 4.3% and 2.9%).
- Of Peel's three municipalities, Brampton continued to have the highest proportion of Blacks within its population (13.5%), followed by Mississauga with 6.3% and Caledon with 2.0%.
- Between 2006 and 2011:
 - ❖ The proportion of Black people living in Peel rose from 8.3% to 9.0% of the total Peel Population.
 - ❖ The number of Blacks increased across Peel's municipalities, but the greatest rate of growth was in Caledon where the Black population increased by 40.1%: from 860 to 1,205. This was followed by Brampton with a growth rate of 31.9% and Mississauga at a lower rate of 8.3%.
 - ❖ The rate of growth of the Black population in Peel (21.8%) was less than that of the overall visible minority population (27.2%) but greater than that of the Peel population as a whole (11.9%).
- The Black population remains the second largest visible minority group in Peel next to South Asians.



The Black Population in Peel by Gender, 2011

Highlights

- Peel has a greater proportion of Blacks that are female than Canada or Ontario.
- Across Canada, Ontario, Peel and all of its municipalities, the number of Black females is greater than the number of Black males.
- Of the municipalities in Peel, Brampton had the highest proportion of Black males (47.0%), followed by Caledon with 46.5% and Mississauga with 45.6%.
- Conversely, Mississauga had the highest proportion of Black females (54.4%), followed by Caledon with 53.1% and Brampton with 53.0%.
- Between 2006 and 2011, while the Black female population in Peel increased by a greater number, the male population appeared to grow at a slightly greater rate (21.7% versus 21.9% respectively).

The Peel Population by Selected Ethnic Origins, 2011

The following section provides an overview of the presence of African and Caribbean ethnic origins in Canada, Ontario, Peel and its municipalities. While this information is useful to consider, there are a few cautions that must be noted when interpreting the data:

1. As noted by Statistics Canada "'African origins' should not be considered equivalent to the 'Black' population group or visible minority status, as there are persons reporting African origins who report a population group or visible minority status other than 'Black.' Conversely, many people report a population group or visible minority status of 'Black' and do not report having 'African' origins."

The above is true, likely to an even greater extent, for Caribbean origins. The reader will note in some sections the category "Selected" Caribbean origins. This includes only origins pertaining to countries where the black population makes up over 85% of the total population (see Appendix A for further details).

- 2. Ethnic origin data in the National Household Survey is a reflection of the respondent's perception of his or her ethnic ancestry at the time of collection.
- 3. Respondents may provide multiple origins and thus calculations are based on proportion of responses rather than proportion of respondents.

Highlights

- Across Peel's municipalities, Caribbean origins were the fourth most commonly reported origins (of eight). African origins were the fifth most reported, with the exception of Caledon where they were seventh.
- Comparatively, in Ontario and Canada as a whole, African and Caribbean origins were ranked among the fifth and sixth mostly frequently reported origins.
- African and Selected Caribbean* origins made up 8.6% of reported ethnic origins in Peel.
- African and Selected Caribbean origins made up a greater proportion of reported origins in Peel, than in Ontario or Canada as a whole.
- The highest proportions were in Brampton (11.7%), followed by Mississauga with 6.9% and lastly Caledon where these origins make up only 2.2% of reported origins.
- In Peel, "Jamaican" was the most commonly reported origin of the selected Caribbean origins and Central and West African was the most commonly reported of African origins.

Breakdown of Ethnic Origins by Frequency Reported: Peel and its Municipalities, 2011



The Peel Immigrant Population and Place of Birth, 2011

Highlights

Immigrant Population

- 10.7% of the immigrant population in Peel was born in Africa, Jamaica, or Haiti.
- The Peel Region has a greater proportion of immigrants from Africa than Ontario (5.6% versus 5.4%), but a smaller proportion than Canada as a whole (7.3%).
- Peel Region had a greater proportion of immigrants from Jamaica than Ontario or Canada (5.0% versus 3.1% and 1.9%).
- Peel has a lower proportion of immigrants from Haiti than Ontario or Canada (0.1% versus 0.3% and 1.2%)
- The largest African immigrant populations in Peel were from Egypt, followed by Nigeria, Kenya and "Other" places of birth in Africa.
- Of Peel's municipalities, Mississauga has the greatest proportion of immigrants from Africa with 5.8%, followed by Brampton (5.4%) and Caledon (1.2%).
- Brampton has the largest proportion of immigrants from Jamaica (7.8%), followed by Caledon (4.4%) and Mississauga (3.1%).

Recent Immigrant Population

- 11.1% of the <u>recent</u> immigrant population was born in Africa, Jamaica, or Haiti.
- The Peel Region had a lower proportion of <u>recent</u> immigrants from Africa (8.1%) than Ontario or Canada as a whole (8.2% and 12.5% respectively).
- Peel Region had a greater proportion of <u>recent</u> immigrants from Jamaica than Ontario or Canada as a whole (2.9% versus 1.7% and 0.8%).
- Peel has lower proportion of <u>recent</u> immigrants from Haiti than Ontario or Canada (0.1% versus 0.8% and 1.7%)
- The largest <u>recent</u> African immigrant populations in Peel were from Nigeria, followed by Egypt, Mauritius and "Other" places of birth in Africa.
- Of Peel's municipalities, Mississauga has the greatest proportion of recent immigrants from Africa with 9.0%, followed by Brampton with 6.8%.
- In contrast, Brampton has a more substantial proportion of <u>recent</u> immigrants from Jamaica with 5.1%, than Mississauga with 1.4%.
- According to the data, Caledon has no <u>recent</u> immigrants from Africa, Jamaica or Haiti.

Distribution of the African Immigrant Population: Peel and its Municipalities, 2011



Distribution of the Recent African Immigrant Population in Peel and its Municipalities, 2011



SOCIAL IMPLICATIONS

This report has provided a socio-economic profile of the Black population in Peel, with the aim of assisting in the planning and prioritizing of services for this group. Four themes or trends can be used to describe this profile, which are summarized in the following chart.

Peel Compared to Ontario and Canada (2006)

A comparative perspective of Peel yields a picture which says that on average, the Black population in Peel, compared to the Black population of Ontario and Canada as a whole, is:

- · more likely to report English as their mother tongue
- more family oriented
- more property conscious (likely to own their homes)
- better-educated (more likely to have high school education or above)
- more involved in the labour market
- richer (economically speaking); and
- more diverse (likely to be born outside Canada)

Implications for Peel's Human Services Sector:

While there is still evidence of vulnerability, compared to the Black population in Ontario and Canada, Black people in Peel are in a better position to actively participate in community development programs and to make positive contributions for improving the quality of life in their community. Some areas that should be emphasized include:

- leadership (personal, civic, etc.)
- civic participation (participation in government, community organizations, etc.)
- volunteerism
- mentoring
- fundraising/charitable giving
- multiculturalism and positive race relations
- family-centred facilities and services
- business entrepreneurship

- For most of the countries, the "mixed category" does not specify what combination of race/ethnicity the people are.
- These figures represent more recent data and may not be representative of the history of the country/origin (there may have been a greater or smaller proportion of Black people in the past).
- The proportion of Blacks in the Caribbean country may be quite different from the proportion of Blacks in the population that immigrates to Canada from that respective country.

Appendix C: Definitions of Socio-Demographic Indicators

Demographic and Cultural Characteristics

Population: Size, Age & Growth

Population Growth between 2006 and 2011 is calculated in the following way:

[(P2011 - P2006)/(P2006)]*100

Immigrant Population

- Immigrants refers to people who are or have ever been a landed immigrant/ permanent resident. Landed immigrants are people born outside of Canada who have been permitted by immigration authorities to live in Canada permanently; some will have lived in Canada for a number of years, while others have arrived recently.
- Recent immigrants are immigrants who landed in Canada between January 1, 2006 and May 10, 2011 (according to the 2011 NHS).

Visible Minorities

Under the *Employment Equity* Act of Canada, members of visible minorities are persons, other than Aboriginal persons, who are non-Caucasian in race or non-white in colour.

Language (Mother Tongue)

Refers to the first language learned at home in childhood and still understood by the individual at the time of the Census.

Household and Family Characteristics

Marital Status (Legal)

- Marital status is defined as a person's conjugal status under the law (e.g. single, married, divorced, separated, widowed).
- Never legally married (single) refers to persons who have never married (including all persons less than 15 years of age) and persons whose marriage has been annulled and who have not remarried.
- Legally married (and not separated) refers to persons whose spouse is living, unless the couple is separated or a divorce has been obtained.

- Separated, but still legally married refers to persons currently married, but who
 are no longer living with their spouse (for any reason other than illness or work)
 and have not obtained a divorce.
- Divorced refers to persons who have obtained a legal divorce and who have not remarried.
- Widowed refers to persons who have lost their spouse through death and who have not remarried.

Census Family

Refers to a married couple (with or without children of either or both spouses), a common-law couple (with or without children of either or both partners) or a lone parent of any marital status, with at least one child living in the same dwelling. A couple may be of opposite or same sex. 'Children' in a census family include grandchildren living with their grandparent(s) but with no parents present.

Persons Living Alone

The proportion of the population aged 15 years and over, living alone in a dwelling, in relation to the total number of persons aged 15 years and over in private households.

Home Ownership/Occupied Private Dwelling

Refers to a private dwelling in which a person or a group of persons is permanently residing and whether the dwelling is owned or rented by the person(s) living therein.

Socio-Economic Characteristics

Education

Highest level of schooling refers to the highest grades or year of elementary or secondary (high) school attended, or to the highest year of college or university education completed. University education is considered to be a higher level of schooling than college education.

Employment

- Labour force refers to all persons, 15 years of age and over, excluding
 institutional residents, who were either employed or unemployed during the
 week (Sunday to Saturday) prior to the Census day.
- Participation rate refers to the total labour force, expressed as a percentage of the population 15 years of age and over.
- Unemployment rate refers to the unemployed labour force expressed as a percentage of the total labour force.

Income

- Total Income refers to the total money income received from the following sources during the calendar year 2005 by person 15 years of age and over: wages and salaries (total); net farm income; net non-farm income from unincorporated business and/or professional practice; Child benefits; Old Age Security pension and Guaranteed Income Supplement; benefits from Canada or Quebec Pension Plan; benefits from Employment Insurance; other income from government sources; dividends, interest on bonds, deposits and savings certificates, and other investment income; retirement pensions, superannuation and annuities, including those from RRSPs and RRIFs; other money income.
- Employment Income refers to total income received by persons 15 years of age and over during calendar year 2005 as wages and salaries, net income from a non-farm unincorporated business and/or professional practice, and/or net farm self-employment income.
- Census Family Income refers to the sum of the total incomes of all members of that family.
- Economic Family refers to a group of two or more persons who live in the same dwelling and are related to each other by blood, marriage, common-law or adoption. A couple may be of opposite or same sex. For 2006, foster children are included.
- Unattached Individuals refers to household members who are not members
 of the economic family. A person living alone is defined as an unattached
 individual.
- Low Income before tax cut-offs refer to income levels at which families or
 persons not in economic families spend 20% more than average of their before
 tax income on food, shelter and clothing. The following is Statistics Canada's
 2005 matrix of low income before tax cut-offs (1992 base):

Appendix D: Technical Notes

- 1. Definition of Forward Sortation Areas (FSAs) and Approach to the Selection of FSAs
- Forward Sortation Area (FSA) refers to the first three characters of the
 postal code. FSAs are associated with a postal facility from which mail
 delivery originates. The average number of households served by an FSA is
 approximately 8,000, but the number can range from zero to more than 60,000
 households. This wide range of households can occur because some FSAs may
 serve only businesses (zero households) and some FSAs serve very large
 geographic areas.
- 32 FSAs were selected within the Peel Region to be included in this report. They
 were chosen based on a combination of "natural" boundaries and practical
 limits on manipulating the data. The FSAs not used in this report include: LOG,
 LOJ, LON, and LOP. The selected 32 FSAs represent around 99% of the total
 population of Peel.

2. Indicators Selected

 The indicators selected for this report were based on availability of data, importance/priority and quality. These indicators represent a small subset of the data collected by the 2006 Census of Canada and the 2011 National Household Survey.

3. Limitations of the Information Presented

 Differences between the 2006 mandatory long-form census and the voluntary 2011 National Household Survey may affect the comparability of data over time. There is an element of uncertainty as to whether and to what extent a change in a variable reflects real change or arises from the change in methodology. In addition, due to the change in data collection methods, the 2011 NHS data is subject to quality issues. For more information see: http://www.statcan.gc.ca/ eng/survey/household/nhs

- When comparing two point estimates or when looking at time trends, tests of significance were not done. Thus, differences or time trends may or may not be statistically significant. Caution must therefore be used in interpreting any differences found.
- The availability of 2011 data specific to the Black population was limited, and therefore 2006 data was used instead. As such data is 8 years old, it must be used with caution.
- Data on health and crime statistics are excluded from this report.
- Data on the areas covered by postal codes L4V, L5P, L5S and L5T is not included in this report (due to geographic boundary complexities, overlap with other Regions, etc.).
- Comparison of indicators at the FSA and City level are beyond the scope of this report. This level of analysis will be addressed through future reports.
